Within the NAMASTE+ project, the Georg-August-Universität Göttingen (UGOE) offers scholarships for **staff members from International Relations Offices** of the above listed universities.

The selected staff members will participate in the 14th International Staff Training Week taking place in Göttingen from May 11 – 15, 2020. During this week, the participants will have the opportunity to meet with colleagues from European and non-European countries in an enriching exchange, share best practices and participate in workshops on internationalization themes. Once the grantees are selected, they will receive information on how to register to the International Staff Training Week.

The deadline for submission of the applications is **October 18, 2019**

The grantees shall be in Göttingen on Sunday May 10, since in the evening there will be a welcome event. The last meeting/event will take place on Friday May 15, in the evening.

Travel: Travel (round trip economy class flight) will be organized by the grantee him/herself. The grantee will receive the travel costs (a lump sum of 1075 EUR) upon arrival in Göttingen.

Accommodation: The hotel costs will be covered by the grantee from his/her scholarship. The NAMASTE+ team will book the hotel for the grantee in advance and will give the grantee two different price options from which to choose.

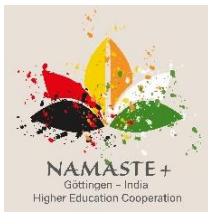

Eligibility criteria

The selection criteria established within the NAMASTE+ project include:

- Quality of the application (clearly defined goals and expected outcomes, expected impact)
- Aptitudes (such as intercultural readiness, interpersonal skills and problem solving)
- Qualifications and work experience
- The priority will be given to those institutions, where International Offices are in the process of establishment or are recently established
